Congratulations! Your recent employment as a Principal performer in Nike on October 26, 2010 qualifies you for membership in Screen Actors Guild (SAG), the most distinguished performers' union in the world. For most actors, joining the Guild is a significant rite of passage and proof of your professional status. Your SAG card will be a symbol of success and of solidarity with a community of 125,000 talented and accomplished artists worldwide.

We encourage you to join and begin enjoying the benefits, privileges and rights the Guild offers professional performers. As a Screen Actors Guild member you have the collective strength and power of the entire professional acting community on your side. Membership in the Guild says that you are an experienced professional who requires certain minimum standards for wages and working conditions. It also entitles you to specially-arranged SAG member seminars, panels, deals and discounts and a voting right for the internationally acclaimed SAG Awards.

What does it take to join? All new members pay a one-time-only initiation fee and semi-annual dues at the time of joining. The national initiation fee rate is currently \$2277.00 (initiation fees may be lower in some states). Annual dues are \$116, plus 1.85% of your previous year's SAG earnings. Simply contact the National Guild Membership Department or one of the locations listed on the reverse side of this letter to determine the initiation fee in your area. Understanding of the issues that actors face, the AFTRA/SAG Federal Credit Union (aftrasagfcu.org), in partnership with the Guild, has designed a loan program that eases the financial burden of the initiation fee for those who qualify. Please read the enclosed flyer for details. This program is not available to individuals who reside in New York. Please note that in some states (including New York and California), SAG's collective bargaining agreements require that you become a member or pay the Guild certain fees in a manner described in the enclosed document.
